POLICY REMINDERS

~When you see a "note" taped to your child's cubby please make sure you read and respond to those correspondence.

~We would also like to remind parents that you pay for your child by the week, not by the day. So, if a holiday falls on the weekday you will pay for the entire week.

~Weekly tuition is due every Monday by 5:30 pm. If you are late with your payment, please include a late fee. The late fee is \$5/day.

~If inclement weather necessitates closing of the Center, announcements will be made on the Center's answering service. We try and keep our doors open the best we can, however, if Southeast Polk Schools are closed it is a good indicator to call the Center. We are not necessarily closed when they are but it is a guideline for you to follow.

~ Medications are given at the Center; however, proper labels will be required (by the physician or pharmacist if the medication is a prescription) or clearly marked on the bottle/container for nonprescription medications, you cannot bring medication in syringes or placed in baby bottles. Parents need to complete a medication form prior to the staff dispensing the medication. Thanks!

~ Please remember to sign your child in and out of the Center daily and physically walk them to their room. This is very important for many reasons. One being to allow the staff/center to know at a glance if your child is present in case of a fire/tornado etc.... we rely on the sign in record for so many things, such as, staffing purposes dietary and purchasing orders, childcare funding. Not only are they a needed item they are required. So, when signing your child in for the day make an adult sign them in and NOT a child



When entering the parking lot area please enter through the east entrance and

exit from the west entrance. This will help keep the flow of traffic in one direction to prevent accidents from occurring. Also, we ask that everyone please go slow and be aware of others in the parking lot. We want everyone to stay safe. There are times children get away from their parents and dart in front of other vehicles.



DIAPER & WIPES

Diapers and wipes are due the first Monday of every month! This has always been a good way for us to keep a supply of diapers for your child here at the Center. Keep in mind if we do not have a supply of your child's diapers, we will use the daycare supplies, however you will be charged \$1.00 per diaper. We appreciate everyone bringing their supply when needed. Thank you!

Guidance

CLEANING

The center will be cleaning and disinfecting frequently touched surfaces (e.g., door handles, sink handles, drinking fountains, grab bars, hand railings, bathroom stalls, tables) at least daily or between each use as much as possible. We will limit the use of shared objects (e.g., toys) when possible, or if shared use is required, they will be thoroughly cleaned

between each use. Rooms will be sanitized at the end of each day.

ILLNESS, SCREENING, AND TESTING

The center will conduct daily health checks (i.e., temperature screening and

symptom checking) to ensure that staff and children are not admitted to a child care setting when they are ill. Children should stay home if their parent is ill. If a child's parent is ill the child will be sent home and further have the parent call their primary healthcare provider to give direction on their health and safety. Sick children will be separated until they are able to go home. Children and staff ill with COVID-19 should be isolated in accordance with the CDC guidelines.

Hydration:

Children and staff are encouraged to bring their own water to minimize use and touching of water fountains.

PHYSICAL DISTANCING

The center will restrict the number of people allowed in communal spaces at one time to ensure everyone can stay at least 6 feet apart. Space seating when feasible.

The facility will ensure that children and staff groupings are as static as possible by having the same group of children stay with the same staff as much as possible. Limit mixing between groups if possible.



HYGIENE



The center will encourage healthy hygiene behaviors by providing adequate supplies, including soap, paper towels, tissues, and/or hand sanitizer containing at least 60 percent alcohol. Staff and children will be required to wash their hands when entering the facility. The facility will discourage sharing of items that are difficult to clean or disinfect (e.g., plush toys). Children will be discouraged from bringing plush toys from home. Blankets will be sent home daily to be washed.

FACE COVERINGS

Adults will wear face



coverings, if medically appropriate. All school-aged children should be encouraged to wear a face covering when able to do so correctly and safely.



School Transportation:

The van used to transport the school age children to Pleasant Hill Elementary Schools will be <u>c</u>leaned and sanitized frequently touched surfaces, in between uses and the children will be required to wash their hands upon entry to the facility.
